CHAPTER ONE Proper Hijab My Choice To Wear The Khimar

I cannot adequately express my feelings about Allâh and Islam. There are no words in the human language to convey my feelings. Being raised a Christian in America, I was perpetually lost. *Alhamdulillah*! Allâh saved me. He literally brought me from the darkness into the light. There is no better way to express what it feels like to find Islam than Allâh, the Almighty's words from the Noble Qur'ân. Allâh, the Almighty says:

"Alif-Lām-Rā. (This is) a Book which We have revealed to you (O Muhammad) in order that you might lead mankind out of darkness (of disbelief and polytheism) into light (of belief in the Oneness of Allâh and Islāmic Monotheism) by their Lord's Leave to the Path of the All-Mighty, the Owner of all praise." [1]

One should say that, "Allâh, the Almighty, gave me right guidance, and I reverted back to Islam", instead of saying that, "I converted to Islam." As Islam is our natural nature.

The Prophet 🞉 said:

«كُلُّ مَوْلُودٍ يُولَدُ عَلَى الْفِطْرَةِ فَأَبَوَاهُ يُهَوِّدَانِهِ أَوْ يُنَصِّرَانِهِ أَوْ يُمَجِّسَانِهِ»

"Every infant is born with an innate disposition, but it is his parents who make him a Jew, or a Christian or a Magian." [1]

Hence the *Tawhid*, or the belief in the Oneness of Allâh is man's innate belief.

Allâh, the Almighty says:

"And (remember) when your Lord brought forth from the Children of Adam, from their loins, their seed (or from Adam's loin his offspring) and made them testify as to themselves (saying): "Am I not your Lord?" They said: "Yes! We testify," lest you should say on the Day of Resurrection: "Verily, we have been unaware of this." Or lest you should say: "It was only our fathers aforetime who took others as partners in worship along with Allâh, and we were (merely their) descendants after them; will You then destroy us because of the deeds of men who practised Al-Bātil (i.e. polytheism and committing crimes and sins, invoking and worshipping others besides Allâh)?" [2]

And:

﴿ أَفَغَيْرُ دِينِ ٱللَّهِ يَبْغُونَ وَلَهُ مَ أَسْلَمَ مَن فِي ٱلسَّمَوَاتِ وَٱلْأَرْضِ طَوْعًا وَكَامُ مَن فِي ٱلسَّمَوَاتِ وَٱلْأَرْضِ طَوْعًا وَكِيْهِ يُرْجَعُونَ ﴿ إِنَّ ﴾

"Do they seek other than the religion of Allâh (the true Islamic Monotheism worshipping none but Allâh Alone), while to Him submitted all creatures in the heavens and the earth, willingly or unwillingly. And to Him shall they all be returned." [1]

After accepting Islam, I have studied and learned more about Christianity than I ever did as a Christian. As a Christian, I was taught to take everything I was told to be the truth. I was never encourged to investigate and search for the truth. In Islam, we are told to make certain that what someone, even an Imam, tells us something, pertaining to our religion, that it is correct. We are encouraged to read it for ourselves, either in the Qur'ân or in *Ahadith*. We are not to just accept blindly, the words of another, else we might commit *Bid'ah* (invention in the religion).

Christianity never made sense to me. I would study the Bible and afterwards, I was only confused. There were so many contradictions. How could God's Word be filled with contradictions? I thought I was stupid, or a very bad Christian, it just didn't make sense to me. Growing up, I would ask my mother about these contradictions and things I couldn't understand. Her answer to me was always the same, "We shouldn't ask these things, some things are only for God to know. You shouldn't question about God and the Bible." But I had so many questions

and I couldn't find the answers. Growing up, I thought I was a very bad person because it just didn't make sense. I would pray that God would forgive me for being so 'stupid'. I just couldn't get it. It wasn't until researching Islam that I discovered that while in truth, Allâh sent Books before the Qur'ân, the Scriptures of Abraham, the Torah, the Psalms and the Gospel, much of them has been lost, and what remains of the original texts have been mixed with what people's own hands have written, as confirmed in the Noble Qur'ân. Allâh, the Almighty says:

"Then woe to those who write the Book with their own hands and then say, "This is from Allâh," to purchase with it a little price! Woe to them for what their hands have written and woe to them for that they earn (thereby)." [1]

Alhamdulillah! Allâh, the Almighty has preserved and guarded the Qur'ân. Allâh, the Almighty says:

"Verily, We, it is We Who have sent down the Dhikr (i.e. the Qur'ān) and surely We will guard it (from corruption)." [2]

And:

"Do they not then consider the Qur'ān carefully? Had it been from other than Allâh, they would surely have found therein many a contradiction." [1]

I didn't understand the concept of 'the Father, Son and Holy Ghost', how could God be three people? Allâh, the Almighty says:

"Surely, disbelievers are those who said: "Allâh is the third of the three (in a Trinity)." But there is no Ilāh (god) (none who has the right to be worshipped) but One Ilāh (God — Allâh). And if they cease not from what they say, verily, a painful torment will befall on the disbelievers among them." [2]
