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

There are six vowels in Arabic Alphabet, three of them are short and the other three are long.

# **Short Vowels**

(i) Vowel "a" (
$$a = \angle Fathah$$
) ( $Ja = \underbrace{\Leftarrow}$ ) ( $Ba = \underbrace{\checkmark}$ )

This mark (<) written on the top of the Arabic letter is called *Fathah* and stands for short (a) this vowel is pronounced as "a" in the "apple".
